TCA educates Texans and builds alliances to enhance and sustain wildlife habitat and to protect our land, air, and water for future generations. TCA has built public support to establish numerous wildlife refuges, state and federal parks, wilderness areas, and other wildlife areas, resulting in more than 250,000 Texas acres protected. TCA has recruited thousands of Texans to active conservation and advocacy through grassroots coalitions and community-driven, hands-on habitat restoration programs that welcome all communities into conservation and promote stewardship for Texas' wildlife and wild places.

General Summary

Texas Conservation Alliance (TCA) is seeking interns who are passionate about protecting Texas wildlife and their habitats. TCA's Careers in Conservation Internship Program helps train future conservation leaders of Texas. Participants work alongside TCA's seasoned conservation professionals and experience the frontlines of saving wildlife and their habitats in the state. Internship projects vary, but the opportunity to develop technical acumen, exercise transferable skills, and cultivate conservation leadership is integral to every TCA experience.

Selected candidates will work with TCA staff to implement wildlife conservation projects. The 10-week internship offers opportunities to make positive impacts on wildlife and provides valuable, hands-on learning experiences and professional development opportunities applicable to future careers in sustainability and conservation.

Responsibilities

Propagate native prairie plants:

- Interns are required to assist with plant propagation at the Native Plant Propagation Center at Dallas Zoo at least two days a week.

Organize wildlife habitat restoration events:

- Research conservation opportunities, build community partnerships, and coordinate event logistics.
- Promote community engagement in wildlife conservation through events, presentations, and social media.
- Build partnerships with other organizations to deliver collaborative conservation initiatives

- Design and deliver community conservation events, reforestation/tree planting, prairie restoration events, and more
- Coordinate all aspects of volunteer events, including marketing, logistics, communication, and documentation, with assistance from mentors and TCA staff
- Write event recaps and highlights to inform internal and external audiences of TCA's accomplishments

Physical Abilities and Work Environment

- Ability to work outdoors for long periods of time.
- Occasionally required to lift and move items up to 25 pounds.

Requirements

- Availability and internet access for weekly update meetings, every Monday from 12 pm – 1 pm (meetings extend to 1:30 pm during professional development sessions)
- Must have a reliable form of transportation
- At least 18 years of age
- Eligible to work in the United States
